

Atiku Abubakar

Atiku Abubakar has had a distinguished career in public service, private business, and philanthropy. Perhaps his most outstanding legacy was his founding and support of the American University of Nigeria, the outstanding private university in sub-Saharan Africa.

Mr. Abubakar was elected Governor of the State of Adamawa and subsequently Vice President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria where he served two terms from 1999 to 2007. His interest in electoral politics and public service began as a student. He graduated with a diploma in law in 1969 from Ahmadu Bello University where he was elected Assistant Secretary General and Deputy Speaker of the Parliament. Soon after, he joined the Government and served for twenty years in the Customs and Excise Department, retiring as Deputy Director in 1989.

Upon leaving the government, Abubakar went into private business and electoral politics. With Nigeria's great leader Shehu Musa Ya'Adua, he dedicated himself to promoting democracy and encouraging the military to return to their barracks. He was a founding member of the Nigeria Social Democratic Party and won the party's nomination for the Gongola State Governorship only to be disqualified by the military. He was then elected to the National Constitutional Conference in 1994, but the next year, the military under General Sani Abacha tried to assassinate him, and he was forced to go into exile in the United States.

He returned to Nigeria after Abacha's death, and the military agreed to permit a free election. As Vice President, Abubakar became known as one of the most competent administrators of Nigeria, chairing the National Economic Council, the National Council on Privatization, the National Planning Commission, and seven other inter-agency committees. He helped create and empower the National Anti-Corruption Commission. When President Obasanjo tried to amend illegally the Constitution to permit him to run for a third term, Abubakar led the opposition, and while he succeeded in maintaining the Constitution, Abubakar's own candidacy was undermined by Obasanio.

His early education was greatly influenced by American Peace Corps teachers, including Lowell Fewster, Stephen Krasner, Stephen Clapp, and Rod Larson. Using the resources that he earned through his many successful business interests in agriculture, oil and energy services, insurance, and pharmaceuticals, Mr. Abubakar funded hundreds of scholarships for Nigerians to study at home and abroad. He built hundreds of schools and health facilities, and in 2004, he joined in partnership with the American University of Washington, D.C. to build the best private university in Africa - the American University of Nigeria.

The American University of Nigeria today offers a world-class, American style education for 1,400 students in three schools - Entrepreneurship and Business, Communications and Technology, and Arts and Sciences. Taught by 90 professors, AUN's graduates are the most valued in Nigeria, and many have gone to the best graduate schools in the world, including American University, Georgetown, Cornell, and the University of Michigan.

No private businessman in Africa has worked harder for democracy or contributed more to the progress of higher education than Atiku Abubakar. And he himself acknowledges that one of the main reasons was the influence of his Peace Corps teachers.




Population 2050












Context: Number of Out of School Children 2009-2012





Development Indicators

- ✓ ILLITERACY-70-80% in the Northeast
- ✓ Infant, child and maternal mortality. 2nd highest in the highest in the world 10% of all Global maternal deaths
- √ "Nigeria has some of the worst education indicators globally." The primary net-enrollment ratio fell from 61% in 1999 to 58% in 2010, while the regional average increased from 58% to 76% over the same period
- ✓ Nigeria accounts for almost one out of five out-of-school children worldwide (UNESCO Institute for Statistics 2013)



Current Status

June-July 2016

- USAID gives us seeds to distribute to 50,000
- His Excellency Atiku Abubakar gives us seeds for 20,000
- Distributed using our expanded peace network in Borno.

September, 2016

- Widespread, credible reports of famine.
- 3 million more out of school children

Conclusions—the Peace Corps Legacy

1. We have a model that prevented our youth from joining Boko Haram—it can be replicated.

- 1. We have a model that kept close to 300,000 internally displaced people alive during the insurgency- it be used in other conflict settings.
- 2. While Boko Haram is being defeated-the resulting problems of famine, out of school children, lack of jobs and infrastructure are even larger problems. They need to be solved: we have some solutions.









The AUN Model


- Engage students to be leaders by exposing them to hard challenges and assisting them to find solutions



AUN-API Model

- 1. Built on trust and respect, accountability and transparency
- 2. Committed local organization with common goals, and proven results, working together to solve local problems
- 3. Educational institution with an academic community, advanced technological resources and student/staff volunteers, feeding hundreds of thousands of IDPs
- **4. Expanding** our AUN-API model and programs that are contributing to prevention, peace and development and implement reconstruction projects in NE Nigeria



Conclusions

- AUN-API is a local effort that effectively managed and protected 95% of IDPs in our area.
- International response arrived late, was inadequate and incorrectly targeted
- IDPs in Yola are still in great need. Those who returned home need food, medicine and housing.
- According to API members, not one child joined
 Boko Haram from Yola

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Boko Haram AND CHIBOK

- Opposed to education
- 276 girls kidnapped on April 14, 2014
- 58 escaped. The sister of one of our guards escaped.
- Chibok school set up a register of who was kidnapped, and who escaped. We drove and brought 11 in August, 2014.
- 24 Students from Chibok are excelling at AUN
